

59th Annual Friendship Tournament Rules 2025

Eligibility: This is a Southern California 600 club Friendship tournament from San Luis Obispo County and South. Current active clubs are opening tournament to any female with USBC certification in good standing (2025-26 Season).

- a) If the local 600 Club requires a uniform, that uniform must be worn at tournament.
 - No Short-Shorts, Spandex-type garments, tank tops, halter tops, hats or caps of any kind will be allowed. Exception: hats and caps for medical purposes must be approved by the tournament committee.

USBC Certified Tournament

Tournament will be held at Forest Lanes, 22771 Centre Dr, Lake Forest, CA 92630

Tournament Format: This is a 4-game, singles, handicap, and USBC-certified tournament, to be held on Sunday October 12, 2025. **Entries close on October 9, 2025**

- a) Subs are allowed if bowler unable to attend.
- b) No walk-ins are allowed.
- c) Check-in time is one (1) hour prior to squad time.
- d) Handicap will be 90% of 220 per game.

Averages: Highest USBC average from bowl.com to be used in order given:

- a) 2024-25 highest published average of 21 games or more. If none,
- b) 2023-24 highest published average of 21 games or more. If none,
- c) Current (2025-26 season) average of 21 games or more. Verification must accompany entry.
- d) If a certified "Sport" league average is the bowler's only average, then it will be adjusted per the chart in the USBC rulebook to determine the correct entering average. USBC Rule 201a-c will apply.
- e) If none of the above, bowl scratch.
- f) USBC Rules 319a-c will be in effect. (Waived 319a2 and 319d-f)

Re-Rating: The average of a bowler may be adjusted upward before she participates. If assigned average is not accepted by the bowler, entry fee will be refunded (USBC Rule 319c).

Entry Fee: Cost of tournament will not exceed \$50.00, of which expenses will be \$3.00, with the hosting club (Prize Fund \$25.00, Expenses \$3.00, Linage \$22.00). There shall be no refund of entry fees, except per rule #4 (see above). Return checks bowler will be responsible for the amount of the check plus any bank fees.

- a) Optional scratch division for those interested \$10.00
- b) Optional Side Pots \$4.00 Each (Handicap & Scratch)
- c) Optional Brackets \$5.00 Each (Handicap & Scratch)

<u>Prize Fund</u>: One (1) cash award for at least every six (6) entries. First place prize money \$325.00, with a minimum of 45 entries. Prize fund will be returned 100%, USBC Rule 309(a)1-2 will apply. All finance charges arising from the distribution of prize funds shall be the responsibility of the hosting club.

a) Optional Scratch will be based on participation.



59th Annual Friendship Tournament Rules 2025

Squad: One (1) squad will be scheduled to bowl at 12:00 PM. Bowling will be four (4) games across eight (8) lanes [odd lane moves left and even moves right]; a limit of three (3) bowlers on a lane, unless number of entries exceed lane availability. Hosting club will assign lanes. Substitutes will be permitted to bowl if they meet eligibility requirements. Tournament Bowlers only allowed in bowlers area.

Entry Form will include: USBC ID number; Bowlers Name; 600 Club and Membership # (if applicable), mailing address; city, state, zip, mobile number and email.

Absent or Blind Scores: will not be allowed. Tardy bowlers will start in the frame being bowled and receive zero (0) for frames missed. No pacers will be allowed.

<u>Awards</u>: One (1) award to be presented to First Place Handicap Series. In case of a tie for first place, co-champions will be declared. Host club will furnish the award(s) and prize money will be presented on tournament day during the banquet.

Hosting Club: San Diego and Orange County will switch off hosting tournament until further notice. The "Toots Cochrane Perpetual Trophy" will also pass between San Diego and Orange County board of directors.

Host Club will present awards and the trophy at the banquet following the tournament. Except for the perpetual trophy, all engraved nameplates will be mailed to the winners within thirty (30) days of tournament completion. The hosting club will be responsible for having the perpetual plaque engraved. Cost not to exceed \$20.00.

Annual Meeting: The hosting club of the current year's tournament will arrange annual meeting to review rules, any changes in cost, and discussion on tournament's successes and concerns.

Banquet Shall be arranged by the hosting club to follow the completion of tournament.

- f) Cost will be \$15.00 per person

The Friendship Tournament

In the 50's and 60's, bowling tournaments of any size were held in Los Angeles or points north. We were told it was because San Diego was considered a "town" not a "city".

One day our San Diego 600 President, Mary Nickason, asked, "Why can't our 600 club have a tournament and invite other 600 Clubs to come here?" So, a little seed was plated and on April 26, 1964, the first Friendship Tournament was held at Frontier Lanes.

Mary had two prerequisites: 1) pay off the day of the event (most tournaments did not in those days), and 2) make first place payoff interesting enough to draw bowlers, but low enough to pay down many places. After all, it was to be a Friendship Tournament.

Our first tournament brought 111 entries, 36 from out of town. Clubs from Southern California as far north as Bakersfield were invited. We felt the driving distance should be within reach for a one-day overall trip. The four games went fast! While Tex Cornwall, Jerry Beary, and Betty Runion checked scores for winners, Mary Nickason played hostess in the Sunset Room, having talented members' stage their own floorshow. Everyone had so much fun a second tournament was set for October 4, 1964,

Clairemont Bowl was the site of the second tournament. After bowling, the management gave us a buffet luncheon. This idea was well received and born to be a part of the tournament. It was also decided to have the winner's home 600 Club host the next Friendship Tournament.

The spouse of Toots Cochran, President of the Los Angeles 600 Club, donated a perpetual trophy. So our wonderful Friendship Tournament was well underway and is still going strong today.
